re: Alan Batters - SHCA Nomination Community Relations Award

I have had the privilege to observe and work with Alan Batters on a few different community events during my two years as an interim pastor/writer in Kipling from Oct. 2017 - October 2019.

I kept hearing of Gee Bee Construction and their CEO, Alan Batters, the moment I moved to Kipling. He wasn't what I expected and I don't mean that in any negative fashion. It was common to hear from local residents how much they appreciated Gee Bee and their many contributions to their community. People really LIKE Alan. Over the two years I have got to know Alan these inner qualities kept sticking out:

Humble
Caring
Authentic
Forward Thinking
Generosity
Self-effacing
Smart
Empathetic

He genuinely cares about his employees, the town he was born in, and giving back to so many. I have observed up close how the morale at Gee Bee Construction is as good as any I have seen over the years in the business world. I took notes. I literally took notes:)

Here is how Gee Bee/Alan made a difference in my sphere of influence:

- i) He was a member of the church I was minster at. When it came to moving from Yorkton and now to Regina, Alan suggested that Gee Bee cover the move financially AND supply Gee Bee employees to assist us. Alan would not take a dime and almost seemed offended that we offered some form of payment. The church appreciated his extra-mile generosity.
- ii) As a church and ministerial we brought in addictions/recovery speaker Rod Pedersen the former voice of the Roughriders. Rod did a community workshop and school assembly the following day for Jr and Sr high students. This event was very well attended. Gee Bee donated a bit over \$1200 to help cover expenses (March 31 and April 1). The follow up for me as a minister/counselor was significant. For the first half of 2019 I only did three counseling sessions in the community. Following The Pedersen Recovery/Mental Health event the counseling jumped to the mid 30's and is still going on even after I moved to Regina.
- iii) Book Signing I needed a place that was attractive and community centered for a book signing. Richie Hall a 35-year CFL player and coach hired me to write his biography. Alan supplied a beautiful venue which attracted close to 100 people. This was one of our better attended book signings on the prairies. Richie Hall still talks about the class book signing we had in Kipling and Windthorst.
- iv) Curling--I am part of a competitive curling team that was going to a national bonspiel in Regina in 2018. We needed some sponsorship money for entry and accommodations. Alan/Gee Bee sponsored us and provided curling jackets that were the envy of the bonspiel. If not for this contribution my team

probably would not have ever experienced our first ever 8-ender, which happened in the playoff round. This propelled the team on to our gold medal victory, where we acknowledged our SPONSOR profusely:)

Alan is very entrepreneurial as I assume the SHCA would be aware of. But, what is easy to cheer for in his nomination for this award is - his high level of integrity, character and GENEROSITY. Alan is the real deal.
